

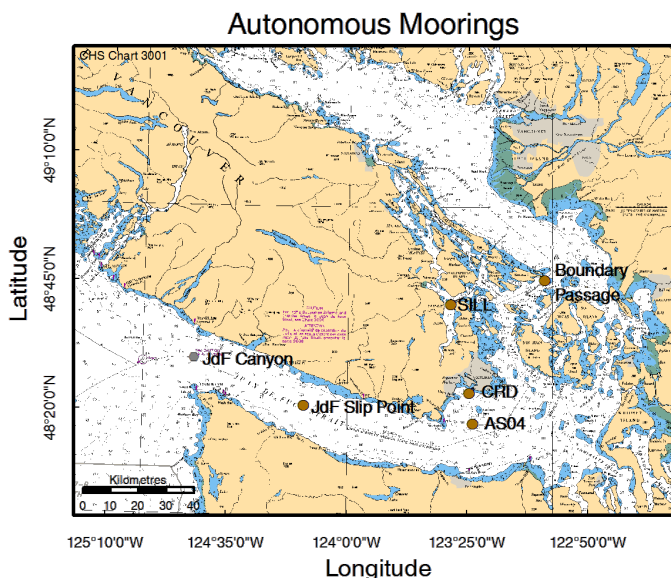
Information for Mariners – October 2020 Ocean Networks Canada: Autonomous Moorings

Project: Ocean Networks Canada (ONC) is an initiative of the University of Victoria and operates a series of ocean observatories. ONC deploys autonomous moorings throughout the Salish Sea which we maintain annually. They extend 10 metres above the seafloor and include a variety of sensors and instruments that measure the surrounding current, dissolved oxygen, temperature, conductivity and depth. What: Fixed moorings holding scientific instruments extend 10 m off the seafloor.

When: Latest system and instrument deployments of moorings: **29 October 2020**

Where: **Juan de Fuca Strait, Boundary Pass, and Saanich Inlet.**
